- Trade job is a specialized craft that requires advanced training and education
- Does not require a 4 year college or university degree
- Often can received training through apprenticeships, on the job training, specialized education programs or institutes.

Partnered Schools

- By doing a trades program you get first year studies paid for by district
- Years 2 and 3 would be after graduation at the post – secondary school to receive full accreditation in the trade



Be Aware

- Although the program tuition is free there are expenses such as material, tools, textbooks etc.
 - This will range based on program
- Students going into grade 12 will need to have all grade 11 courses successfully completed and complete English 12 in summer school
- Some programs do have prerequisites
 - Automotive program suggested physics 11
- Programs are in demand as limited spots are available so there is an application process
- Trades are at other schools in the district, but you will still get to grad at PMSS with friends

Trade and Technical Skill Schools

Requirement for Trade or Technical Skill Program Entrance

- Level of English
 - 60% or higher depending on institution and program
- Level of Math
 - Varies depending on program for example:
 - Electrical, tech, or medical requires foundations of math or pre-calculus 11, possibly grade 12 math as well.
 - Carpentry, Plummer, Welder requires workplace math 11
- Level of Science
 - Variers depending on program for example:
 - Health related fields requires chemistry 11 / 12 and / or life science 11 / anatomy and physiology 12
 - Electrical or tech fields requires physics 11 / 12
